### **SUGGESTIONS FOR TOURS / ITINERARIES**

Please note: These are suggestions. The actual tours and itineraries depend on the season, the weather, wind and swell. You can discuss your options with our Skipper and he will advise you, what is best, according to your interests. **You will have freedom of choice.** 

Please further note: **Zanzibar** archipelago consists of two sister islands. Unguja (often referred to as "Zanzibar") is high-class touristic, with lots of attractions, very beautiful. **Pemba** is pure nature, very much untouched and undeveloped, with only few tourists. The crossing between the two islands takes about 6-8 hours. If you want to sail to Pemba, you either need two weeks charter (at least 9 or 10 days), or you need to commence and/or end your charter there. We are the only charter company, who offer this at no additional cost.

We strongly suggest you book your charter with Chef & food. There are only a few grocery shops, as you know it from Europe or the US. In Pemba this is a must, because we mostly have to purchase directly from the farmer (family) or the fisherman.

## ZANZIBAR CATAMARAN CHARTER

Central to South of Zanzibar and back.

You can only experience these tours with the freedom of a charter boat.

Day 1 (usually Saturday; but flexible): 17:00 Embarkation near Stone Town. Meet the skipper and your Chef. Discuss with them the tour and menu options (special requests and wishes a week before your charter is welcome and will help). Leave the Azam Marina before sunset und anchor sheltered at one of the nearby islands. Dinner on board with the city lights in the background.

**Day 2 (Sunday):** Wake up in the morning, go to swim, go to snorkel, watch the wild birds, possibly see dolphins. Sail South. Stop at Prison Island to see the turtles, to swim, to snorkel. Or at Nakupenda sandbank. Anchor for the night in the South of Zanzibar.

**Day 3 (Monday):** Visit the area around Chumbe Island Marine Reserve. Quiet anchorages far away from the "beaten tourist track" in complete tranquility. Sandbanks, snorkel on coral reef patches. Spend the day snorkeling the protected reef, home to over 400 species of fish and rare corals. See the fishermen at work. You may plan a visit on the island, to learn about their ecological projects, see the historic lighthouse and eco-lodge gardens. Pre-booking is essential (entrance fee).

**Day 4 (Tuesday):** Visit Safari Blue Sandbank and Island. Sandbank, snorkel on coral reef patches. Sandy beach and turquoise waters. Relax, swim, lunch and dinner on board. If you have a very low tide, you can witness the harvesting of sea food on the exposed bottom of the sea., nearby. Quiet anchorages far from tourist crowds. Enjoying a seafood barbecue prepared by the crew. Watch local fishermen in traditional dhows and soak in the beauty.

**Day 5 (Wednesday):** Sail early morning to Kizimkazi to see the dolphins (but no guarantee, as it is wild animals; small entrance fees may be applicable). Anchor nearby for lunch, beach, and swimming and snorkeling.

**Day 6 (Thursday):** Stay one more day, enjoying the pristine beauty or sail North towards Stone Town, the cultural hub of Zanzibar. You may anchor at Stone Town's waterfront for a tour there. Time for last-minute souvenir shopping or a guided spice market visit.

**Day 7 (Friday):** Head back nearby Azam Marina, enjoy lunch or dinner on anchor. Visit sandbanks, beaches, islands, you know the area by now pretty well.

**Day 8 (Saturday):** Enjoy breakfast onboard before saying goodbye to your crew and go into the marina early morning for check-out.

Central to North of Zanzibar and Mnemba Island and back. Same start and end of the charter.

You can only experience this with the freedom of a charter boat.

**Day 2 (usually Sunday):** Sail North towards Tumbatu Island and anchor there in the Marine Park (small entrance fees may be applicable).

Day 3 (Monday): Stay at Tumbatu in the Marine Park for snorkeling and swimming. Go to the empty beautiful beach, often with bathtub warm water (tide dependent). If you have a very low tide, you can witness the harvesting of sea food on the exposed bottom of the sea, by the local people. Enjoying a seafood barbecue prepared by the crew for sunset. Watch local fishermen in traditional dhows and soak in the untouched beauty.

**Day 4 (Tuesday):** Cross over to Kendwa Beach. Visit the golden beach and see the vibe of the resorts, beach bars and restaurants of Nungwe and Kendwa beach. Plenty of time ashore to explore. Activities like jet ski, kajak, paddleboarding and others. Beach relaxation. If you have children, visit the small reptile park with turtles, chameleons, ostrich, snakes and others. Sunset BBQ dinner on board, anchoring there at night.

**Day 5 (Wednesday):** Sail early morning to Mnemba Atoll (marine park entrance fees). World famous. Private island surrounded by one of the best reefs in East Africa (for overnight in the resort, people pay up to \$5000 per room). The relaxing north-coast loop features crystal-clear snorkeling spots, world-class reefs, and pristine beaches, with comfortable daily sailing legs. Swim with dolphins. Evening anchorage off the atoll under a clear night sky (fees may apply).

**Day 6 (Thursday):** Sail back slowly South bound, heading towards Stonetown. Possibly stop or stay overnight at Kendwa, Tumbatu Island, Fukuchani, Mkokotni or Muwanda for beach, swimming, snorkeling or simply relaxation on board. Or take the chance to do a shore excursion and get a taxi to a guided spice plantation tour, learning about cloves, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Sunset dinner on board.

**Day 7 (Friday):** Head back nearby Azam Marina, enjoy lunch or dinner on anchor. Visit sandbanks, beaches, islands, you know the area by now pretty well. Time for last-minute souvenir shopping or a guided spice market visit in or near Stone Town.

**Day 8 (Saturday):** Enjoy breakfast onboard before saying goodbye to your crew and go into the marina early morning for check-out.

## ZANZIBAR CATAMARAN CHARTER

Two weeks tour from Central Zanzibar to the North, Mnemba Island, Pemba Island South and North, original African Village and back.

Same start and end of the charter. Or you consider to embark and/or disembark in Pemba. There are cheap flights (about \$50) from/to Zanzibar to Pemba.

Pemba is untouched nature. Something VERY SPECIAL.

A remote and adventurous itinerary for travelers seeking untouched reefs, original village life, local fishermen and farming, plantations, and tranquil anchorages.

Day 1 (usually Saturday; but flexible): 17:00 Embarkation near Stone Town. Meet the skipper and your Chef. Discuss with them the tour and menu options (special requests and wishes a week beforehand will help). Leave the Azam Marina before sunset und anchor sheltered at one of the nearby islands. Dinner on board with the city lights in the background. Wake up in the morning, go swimming, snorkelling, watch the wild birds, possibly see dolphins.

**Day 2 (usually Sunday):** Sail North towards Tumbatu Island and anchor there in the Marine Park (small entrance fees may be applicable). Coral reef snorkeling right next to the catamaran. Sunset dinner on board.

Day 3 (Monday): Stay at Tumbatu in the Marine Park for snorkeling and swimming. Go to the empty beautiful beach, often with bathtub warm water (tide dependent). If you have a very low tide, you can witness the harvesting of sea food on the exposed bottom of the sea, by the local people. Enjoying a seafood barbecue prepared by the crew for sunset. Watch local fishermen in traditional dhows and soak in the untouched beauty.

**Day 4 (Tuesday):** Cross over to Kendwa Beach. Visit the beach and see the vibe of the resorts, beach bars and restaurants of Nungwe and Kendwa beach. Plenty of time ashore to explore. Activities like jet ski, kajak, paddle board and others. Beach relaxation. If you have children, visit the small reptile park with turtles, chameleons, ostrich, snakes and others. Sunset BBQ dinner on board, anchoring there at night.

Day 5 (Wednesday): Sail early morning to Mnemba Atoll (marine park entrance fees). World famous. Private island surrounded by one of the best reefs in East Africa (for overnight at the resort, people pay up to \$5000 per room). The relaxing north-coast loop features crystal-clear snorkeling spots, world-class reefs, and pristine beaches, with comfortable daily sailing legs. Swim with dolphins. Sail back to Nungwe for anchor overnight, so you can leave early morning for the cross-over to Pemba.

**Day 6 (Thursday):** Sail to Pemba (South). The cross-over is 6-8 hours. You will sail briefly out of land-sight, and adventure in itself. Arrive at the South of Pemba. We try to catch fish on our way (Tuna or similar). Go into the many channels of Pemba, mostly untouched

nature. Anchor at a quiet spot. Enjoy swimming and snorkeling, or the beach, and enjoy dinner on board.

**Day 7 (Friday):** Get up early to find wild dolphins, often up to more than a hundred of them, going with the catamaran, often for an hour or more (but no guarantee as these are wild animals). A once-in-a-lifetime experience. See jumping tuna and wild preying birds. Have breakfast on board and discuss your adventures. Then sailing along the beautiful coastline to the North of Pemba to anchor there, sheltered near an original African village.

Day 8, 9, 10 (Saturday to Monday): You can snorkel on coral reefs right from the catamaran. You can explore by dinghy the channels of Pemba. Use the time for land visits. Our Skipper can guide you. Visit the original African village. Witness how they farm, entirely self-sufficient, for centuries, if not millennia. Take from there a Tuk-Tuk or minivan to explore beaches, spice farms, book a custom lunch with your feet in the sand near the beach. Go swimming at nearby beaches. Visit villages, like Konde. Go with your Chef to the food market and select your dinner: Fresh fish, many delicious fruits, etc.

Or make friends with the fishermen and let them come to show their catch every morning and you can choose. You Chef will prepare the delicious meal.

Cruise north along Pemba's rugged coastline, stopping in fishing villages and visiting plantations. Dinner onboard.

**Day 11 (Tuesday):** Leave towards the South of Pemba. Go either thought the channels or along the beautiful West Coast line. Everything is far away from tourists. Anchor in the South of the island to swim, relax, snorkel, sunbath, go on land to a beach.

**Day 12 (Wednesday):** Cross-over back to Zanzibar. Either to Nungwe, Kendwa or Tumbatu, to repeat what you know already or visit what you have missed last week.

**Day 13 (Thursday):** Sail back slowly South bound, heading towards Stonetown. Possibly stop or stay overnight at Kendwa, Tumbatu Island, Fukuchani, Mkokotni or Muwanda for beach, swimming, snorkeling or simply relaxation on board. Or take the chance to do a shore excursion and get a taxi to a guided spice plantation tour, learning about cloves, cinnamon, nutmeg and more. Dinner on board.

**Day 14 (Friday):** Head back nearby Azam Marina, enjoy lunch or dinner on anchor. Visit sandbanks, beaches, islands, you know the area by now pretty well. Time for last-minute souvenir shopping or a guided spice market visit in Stone Town.

**Day 15 (Saturday):** Enjoy breakfast onboard before saying goodbye to your crew and go into the marina early morning for check-out.


